Scuba Nationals - Lake Oahe - South Dakota

"A Dive That Will Live in Infamy" - (or something like that) - in the memories of those that attended the dive.

What a great event, sponsored by Steamboat Inc. (the local dive shop) it was. Caleb Gilkerson, his family, and staff put on a most excellent event!!!!!!

We all agreed that we have never seen a lake with so many big Walleye!!!!

The MDC divers in attendance were Don Heskett, Mike Van Haele, Bob Benson, and Phil Lamm. Mike's cousins, Gary and Mike Van Haele, and Sage the wonder dog from Montana also joined us for the weekend.

Wednesday, July 23 was the long drive from St Louis/Kansas City area. (14.5 hours from St Louis.)

The weather was warm during the day with calm, to breezy, to gosh awful WINDY conditions on the lake. At times on Saturday/Sunday, there were 4-5 foot white caps on the water!!! Rough water to say the least!!! My butt felt like I had been through a dozen "fanny-wacking" initiation sessions for a fraternity. But we all managed to survive!!

Sunday was the second day of the competition. Another 6.5 hrs in the water. The lake conditions were the same as day one. Visibility was very spotty on the lake. None, to poor, to just slightly better was the norm. And yes, the fish were still hard to find

Many, many Walleye were weighed in over five pounds, with several in the 7-8 pound range. There was also a Northern Pike that weighed in around 10+ pounds. For many, the high light of the weigh-ins were the 20+ pound Buffalo. Most impressive fish!!!

By end of the event Bob and Phil had managed a5th place finish. Don and Mike had an $8^{\rm th}$ or $9^{\rm th}$ place finish. (Out of 32 teams)

Monday, July 28th was the long drive back home.


### St. Louis Area:

## **Just For Fun**

2008 DAN Tech Diving Conference was held addressing physiology, decompression, rebreathers and training with discussions about the operational and medical aspects of technical diving. You can watch or download the video and get access to the Power Point shows for *free* by visiting DAN's website.

The US Navy Supervisor of Diving and Salvage released the newest version of the US Navy Diving Manual in April '08. Revision 6 is available for download at <a href="http://rubicon-foundation.org/index.html">http://rubicon-foundation.org/index.html</a> This update includes updated US Navy Dive Tables.

#### TANK BLACKOUT

If moisture is allowed to remain in a scuba tank, the oxygen in the air in the tank will be lowered as this gas is utilized in the oxidation reaction of the metal. If enough oxygen is utilized, the gas in the tank can become a hypoxic mixture and lead to loss of consciousness while SCUBA diving. Since retention of carbon dioxide with open circuit scuba is unlikely, consciousness can be lost without "air hunger" warning symptoms. Although tank blackout is a rare occurrence, it should be considered and remains a strong motivating factor for not completely depleting the air supply in the SCUBA tank (which may make it possible for moisture to enter). Additionally, it is advisable to have yearly visual inspections of the tank and maintain adequate pressures in the tank (to minimize condensation) when storing a tank for extended periods of time. #### Who Am I?

One threat to them is illegal harvest of adults for caviar.

A: Tinnitus or ringing in the ears can have many causes. Your doctor should investigate the underlying cause regardless is the condition is acute or chronic. Gradual progressive Tinnitus can be due to noise exposure as well as advancing age. It is usually associated with a hearing loss. If the underlying problem is not serious, there is no reason to curtail diving.




